INTRODUCING TIEN VINH


Hi everyone,

A Word from Carol



Hello everyone,

We had our flu clinics in at the end of October and beginning of November. As you may have heard, there was a limited amount of the H1N1 flu vaccine available. Most of our seniors only had seasonal flu vaccine not the H1N1 vaccine during our flu clinics. People 65 and older are least likely to get sick with this virus, but it is still possible to become infected. If they do become infected, they are more likely to develop serious complications from their illness. Therefore, seniors still should get the H1N1 flu vaccine. Our centre does not get the supply of the vaccine from CDC, so we won't be able to have an H1N1 flu clinic. Whoever hasn't had the H1N1 flu shot should contact their doctor or local health clinic to get the H1N1 flu vaccine. Wishing everyone a healthy winter season!



Terceira is a farming island, and Maria's family's farm grew wheat and corn and kept cows. Maria had two sisters and was the middle of the three. She spent her childhood helping her mother with her sisters and the farm work. Maria met her husband, Joe, at the movies. They dated for three years before getting married on Oct. 29th, 1961. Maria and Joe came to British Columbia in 1961, where they lived with her sister in Bear Lake, which is north of Prince George, for a year. In 1972 they bought a house of their own in Vancouver. Maria and Joe do not have any children, but love their cat JoJo very much. Maria loves to crochet and cook.



A Russian Holiday...

Hello, my name is Olga, and I am from Russia. This will be my second Christmas in Canada. Although my family embraces most Canadian traditions, I will hardly get any presents on December 25th. That's fine, because in Russia we celebrate Christmas differently than

you do.

For most Russian people Christmas is a particularly religious holiday. It is celebrated on January 7th because of the 13-day difference in Gregorian and Julian Calendars. On Christmas Eve pious people go to church and stay there for a night service. They listen to a choir singing and pray all night.

The young girls do fortune telling on Christmas Eve. For example, if you want to know at what age you will get married, take a strand of your hair and put it through your mom's (or any married woman's) wedding ring, like a little pendulum. Stop the pendulum, concentrate, and try not to move your hand. After a while, the pendulum will start to swing. Count the swings until the pendulum stops. The number of the swings is the age when you will get married. Sound silly to you? Last time I did that trick the pendulum swung 23 times

Don't worry about the presents though. I will get mine on January 1st. In Russia we celebrate New Year in a similar way you celebrate Christmas. All the family members gather together at the table around 11 pm on the 31st of December. We eat, drink, and chat, recalling events of the outgoing year. When only seconds left before the New Year, we start to count down with the chiming clock. 1... 2... 3... 4... 5... 6... 7... 8... 9... 10... 11... 12!!!!!! We clink glasses, drink Champaign, hug and kiss each other wishing Happy New Year!!! This is the moment we exchange gifts. Children find their presents under the New Year Tree. They believe that the Father Frost and his granddaughter, Snow Maiden, bring them presents.

After the presents are open, a New Year Party starts. We go back to the table, or dance, or go outside to meet friends and set up fireworks. It's the most magic and wonderful holiday of the year.
